I will always remember getting a note from one of my friends after our youngest daughter, Clare, was born. It went something like this “Congratulations on the continuing success of your biological church growth initiative!”

I am happy to say that during the first few months of this year, many other Epiphany families are chipping in to Epiphany’s “biological church growth” as well. In fact, we have had **three** babies born in the last few weeks, and **three** more babies due between now and the middle of 2016.

This is going to mean a number of things, including evaluating our current nursery space and scheduling more than one baptismal service. Until Christ Is Formed In You



One of the joys of pastoral ministry is the deep call to be a reflective person because without it, there is so much to learn from people and the Lord, that true wisdom would be missed.

So, I have been thinking about the process of transformation that happens in our lives as we give up control to our Lord and Creator. See, my faith background, which puts a lot of emphasis on conversion, has only part of the story. Our goal is not mere conversion. Rather this nugget tucked away in a favorite passage of Scripture, says it clearly. **Romans 8:29** For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be *conformed to the image of his Son*. Have you ever thought about how life-changing that is? Our goal is to be conformed to the image in Jesus, to look more and more like our brother every day. We cannot transform ourselves into the image of Christ, but we can create the conditions for growth.

When I look at my life before I completely surrendered to his Lordship I would say it was full of anxiety and control issues. I rejoice that, as I have put myself before the One who wants to change me, slowly, carefully, those things in my life, which do not look like Jesus at all, are being rooted out. God can make this happen but I need to place myself in a position for the work to happen. Prayer, meditation, Scripture study, fasting, solitude, simplicity and corporate worship have their outcome, which is truly glorious: **BEING CONFORMED INTO THE IMAGE OF THE SON.**

What I haven't addressed is that moving in the giftedness of God also plays its role. It is my joyful burden, as a priest to labor on your behalf. Ultimate responsibility is the Lord's. You carry the next level of responsibility, but we your church family here at Church of the Epiphany Anglican labor with you.

I am...in labor until Christ is formed in you. Galatians 4:19.

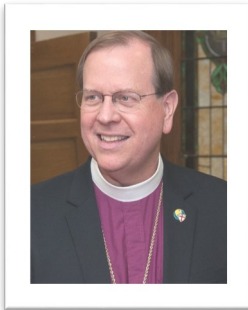
SAVE THE DATE

Missions Update: Steve & Nancy Brown

Steve and Nancy Brown wrote earlier this year [2015] about the damage caused by rioting in Niger, triggered by false rumors about Christians. Here is an email from the Browns discussing their efforts at rebuilding and prayers for friends of the Browns:

Dear friends and family,

Greetings from Maradi, at the end of a good week. The trip to Gouré went very well. I traveled safely both ways.

I was able to divide the SIM land to give the church a piece of land that is over 4 times as big as the lot the old church was on. It is almost too big for them, since it is necessary to build a wall around properties in Niger and this one will have over 200 meters of wall.

They were nonetheless willing to receive such a gift! SIM first constructed houses for missionaries to serve in Gouré in the early 1960s. There is only one church in Gouré after 50 years of work.

After 50 years the SIM property was wiped out. The church was destroyed at the same time, but what was worse, its members were pursued to be killed. They survived, and gave witness to God's blessing, even as a result of these attacks. Now they are taking steps to rebuild. It seemed a good time to be generous.

The Lord blessed our visits Monday morning with officials of the town.

We went to the mayor's office to ask for their advice as we begin to build. This is code for: "If we ask permission, they might just deny us permission to build, so we will ask for their suggestions instead."

In the end, we walked out with local governmental permission to build a church and a youth center on the land that SIM owns. The local town official even hand-wrote our request letter to him, and then immediately wrote out a governmental document giving permission to build. Whatever bureaucratic red tape is, this was the opposite. The "golden tape" of God . . . , granting us favor in their sight? Send up prayers of thanks!

I was on the phone tonight with the friend (MW) that I went to Gouré with. He is facing big challenges, so I told him that I would ask you to pray for him. MW's family currently is living in the United States, waiting the birth of their 2nd child. JW returned to Niger a couple weeks ago to try to find, and bring back to Maradi, a child they had pretty much rescued from the streets of the town where they were living. When MW went to that town after leaving me in Gouré, he found that the extended family had sent the boy to Nigeria. Please pray that he will be able to locate the boy somehow, and get him to Maradi for the start of school in early October.

God is good.
