

Following the Money at Epiphany



This issue of the Star includes a financial report for our recently concluded 2014-15 fiscal year. You can read it beginning on page 7. The short version of what it says is good news: for the first time in quite a few years, income was greater than expenses. At the same time, total income is down.

The main reason for our balanced budget is a bit boring. Over the last several years, we have figured out how to run Epiphany with a significantly smaller staff. What it means for ministry is exciting. For example, even as our total budget has decreased, we have increased our giving as a church to outreach and mission from a budgeted \$67,000 a year three years ago to \$81,364 in current budget. Greater efficiency, and the financial flexibility that has come with it, also means the vestry has also been able to do things like provide funding to support new initiatives, such as providing professional childcare for the new intergenerational women's Bible study that meets on Tuesday mornings.

Our ongoing financial health, as well as our ability to move money to support outreach, mission and new and growing ministries at Epiphany is of course dependent on our continued tithes and offerings (don't stop!). But that said, as a church, our purpose isn't to turn a profit, it is to do the work in mission God has called us to do in the place he has put us. This is actually true for each of us as disciples of Jesus as well. Our purpose isn't to turn a profit, but to do the work in mission God has called each of us to complete.

Many of us at Epiphany have been financially blessed. God has made us stewards of much, instead of little (Matthew 25.14-30). How are we investing what God has given us? All of us at Epiphany can be tempted at times to either save entirely for ourselves (see the warning of Luke 12.16-21), or spend entirely on ourselves (see the warning of Luke 15.11-32). We are called as Christians to resist both of these temptations.

Following our money gives us a picture of our priorities, both as a church and as individuals. What do your financial choices say about your stewardship of what God has given you?

Have any of you had the privilege of being the new kid on the block? The thoughts you have before you even meet people ring like, "Am I going to fit in," or "Will I learn my way around without making a fool of myself?" When my husband and I moved to Istanbul and we knew very little Turkish, we relied on people who were bilingual. So, although I have done this before, that doesn't mean I don't have some of these questions again as I begin my work at Epiphany.

So far, many of you have gone out of your way to welcome me to ministry, tell me a bit about yourself, and help me learn about Epiphany. I'm grateful for that. Here is my appeal: continue to help me as I serve God with you over the next few months. One place I am particularly looking to partner with you is in the vitally important work of carrying forward Epiphany's youth ministry, and even more importantly the Christ-centered relationships among Epiphany's youth during this time of transition. Specifically, I need to know who might host fun activities like a game night and bonfire and I am gathering ideas and resources for a fun outing on a Saturday in October (hiking? rock wall? ice skating?).

A little about myself. In my professional life, I have 7 years experience with college students, but as a mom, I have been a "youth leader" for 19 years. Being a home-schooling mom for some of that time means I am always looking for fun ways to learn. My basic approach is to think of things in as simple and as reproducible terms as possible, but as a missionary, I know it requires us to study culture. As a person who loves to think about discipleship and training, I look for opportunities to grow and stretch myself and others.

Although I have been tasked in part with being the shepherd of our children and youth, I also know that this is something done in cooperation with Epiphany's parents. Adults, you are just as much the guides and permission givers as I am, so the call to participate is not just for the students, but for parents as well. I would like to form a sort of "parents' council" which will help give guidance to how best to serve the students. Ministry done in community is more likely to endure, so I hope to occasionally gather together.

By now, hopefully I have met you all individually and have had the opportunity to hear from all of you what is on your heart.




Pumpkin Carving October 25 at 5pm

Missions Update


Epiphany supports Chad Young, who ministers to young adults at college campuses in the Georgia region. Chad is affiliated with CRU. His wife, Elizabeth, writes about his activities and provides updates on their family. Here is their most recent missionary missive:

This past spring, Chad promised a Mississippi State sophomore that he would do all he could to start a Cru ministry there. Two weeks ago Chad drove to Starkville, MS, to fulfill that promise.

A guy named Josh, who works with Cru at Alabama, will be the next director at MSU. He plans to move there next summer once a team is recruited to go with him. Josh joined Chad at MSU to see if they could launch a ministry. Together they set up a survey table, hosted an informational pizza party, and shared Christ with several guys. Fifty freshmen showed up to the pizza party to learn more about Cru!

A student named Caleb walked up to the survey table and said, "I've been looking for Cru here! I was one of the main student leaders in Cru on my college campus in New Jersey last year. I just transferred to Mississippi State."

Chad met with Caleb the next day for lunch, and Caleb feels like God has brought him to MSU to help lead Cru there. We really felt like the Lord has been going ahead of us, preparing the way. Please continue to pray for Mississippi State! After meeting so many freshmen and seeing the potential for God to change lives, we really want to see God move there!

FINANCIAL REPORT

FISCAL YEAR 2015 (JULY 1, 2014 – JUNE 30, 2015)

Summary

FY 2015 has been a year in which God has blessed Church of the Epiphany. We are in good financial shape and thanks is given to the congregation for their faithful support of God's work here.

The annual stewardship campaign for FY2015 was completed in the late spring of 2014. We received 103 pledges totaling \$836,548. Based on historical patterns the pledges received would support an operating budget of about \$900,000. Therefore, based on recent giving, the Vestry approved a budget of \$899,769. This figure differs slightly from the budget figure shown in last year's report, \$903,769.

The difference was a result of monies, once set aside for Father Walter Barrientos, were given back to the church, due to Father Barrientos change in plans to come to the US.

At the end of the fiscal year (30 June 2015) our expenses were less than budgeted; resulting in an increase in liquid assets of \$30,825.

Shown below is a table of monthly income and expenses by major category for FY2015.

EXPLANATIONS

These are the reasons for variance of expenditures from the January Budget for each category.

WORSHIP

The net cost for altar flowers was less than anticipated because more costs were paid for by parishioner payments than anticipated. Audio expenses were less.

OUTREACH

Money had been budgeted for a possible Mission trip which was not used. Money was given for Father Barrientos to come here and that did not happen so the money was returned to Epiphany.

DISCIPLESHP

Youth expenses were less than anticipated. Nursery expenses were lower than anticipated. These were accomplished by finding low cost ways to run these programs.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE

There was not as much use for the Benevolence Funds as anticipated.

CHURCH OPERATIONS

Less was spent on software and database expenses.

VESTRY

Money designated for special Vestry projects were not used.

PERSONNEL

Money designated for Interns was not used.

FINANCE & LEGAL

Legal fees and the cost for the Property Insurance were down.

As of June 30, 2015 Epiphany has cash on hand of \$278,019.88. While Epiphany reserves the right to use all donations where needed, it is customary to honor donations for specific ministries. A record is maintained of all designated gifts and the uses of such funds. As of June 30, 2015 Epiphany held \$57,406.67 in restricted funds, comprising \$18,200.68 for various ministries and \$39,205.99 in building funds.

The 2016 budget includes salaries for Rector and Assistant Rector and salary increase for staff. Beginning September 1st staff will pay 10% of medical healthcare insurance costs. Last year Epiphany paid 95% of these costs. The budget also includes setting aside \$1,375 per month for future relocation when the lease expires.

The budget for 2016 is \$889,978. Total giving in 2015 was \$898,487. During our spring campaign this year we received 100 pledges. The total pledged was \$815,277. Historically the giving at Epiphany has been more than the total amount of the pledges. Over the years several "multipliers" have been used to establish a reasonable budget based upon pledges received. For fiscal year 2016, the vestry approved a budget that was 1.091 times the pledges received during our stewardship campaign.
