THE FIRST LESSON

Job 14:1-14

¹ “Man who is born of a woman
is few of days and full of trouble.

² He comes out like a flower and withers;
he flees like a shadow and continues not.

³ And do you open your eyes on such a one
and bring me into judgment with you?

⁴ Who can bring a clean thing out of an unclean?
There is not one.

⁵ Since his days are determined,
and the number of his months is with you,
and you have appointed his limits that he cannot pass,

⁶ look away from him and leave him alone,
that he may enjoy, like a hired hand, his day.

⁷ “For there is hope for a tree,
if it be cut down, that it will sprout again,
and that its shoots will not cease.

⁸ Though its root grow old in the earth,
and its stump die in the soil,

⁹ yet at the scent of water it will bud
and put out branches like a young plant.

¹⁰ But a man dies and is laid low;
man breathes his last, and where is he?

¹¹ As waters fail from a lake
and a river wastes away and dries up,

¹² so a man lies down and rises not again;
till the heavens are no more he will not awake
or be roused out of his sleep.

¹³ Oh that you would hide me in Sheol,
that you would conceal me until your wrath be past,

that you would appoint me a set time, and remember me!

¹⁴ If a man dies, shall he live again?

All the days of my service I would wait,
till my renewal should come.

THE PSALM

Psalm 130

¹ Out of the deep have I called unto you, O Lord;
Lord, hear my voice.

² O let your ears consider well
the voice of my supplications.

³ If you, Lord, were to mark what is done amiss,
O Lord, who could abide it?

⁴ For there is mercy with you;
therefore you shall be feared.

⁵ I wait for the Lord; my soul waits for him;
in his word is my trust.

⁶ My soul waits for the Lord,
more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.

⁷ O Israel, trust in the Lord, for with the Lord there is mercy,
and with him is plenteous redemption;

⁸ And he shall redeem Israel
from all their sins.

THE SECOND LESSON

1 Peter 4:1-8

¹ Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same way of thinking, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, ² so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human passions but for the will of God.

³ For the time that is past suffices for doing what the Gentiles want to do, living in sensuality, passions, drunkenness, orgies, drinking parties, and lawless idolatry. ⁴ With

respect to this they are surprised when you do not join them in the same flood of debauchery, and they malign you; ⁵ but they will give account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead. ⁶ For this is why the gospel was preached even to those who are dead, that though judged in the flesh the way people are, they might live in the spirit the way God does.

⁷ The end of all things is at hand; therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers. ⁸ Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 19:38-42

³⁸ After these things Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body. ³⁹ Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. ⁴⁰ So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. ⁴¹ Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. ⁴² So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.
