

A. How would you describe your relationship with God and how you have come to this point in your spiritual journey?

Recently my daily devotional began with the following: “Knowing *about* God is different from *knowing* God.” During my adolescent years I regularly attended Sunday school and church, actively participated in youth activities and during high school served as the church acolyte - I knew *about* God. However, it wasn’t until my junior year in college that I came to *know* God. Through the patient encouragement of a beautiful young woman who would become my life partner, God was transformed, through Jesus, from the omniscient, omnipotent creator to my faithful and personal Redeemer.

I pray we’ll seize this opportunity and help those around us come to know God.

A. How would you describe your relationship with God and how you have come to this point in your spiritual journey?
